Recruitment

- Use varied recruitment methods and locations to attract students
- Adapt materials with role models and different languages
- Train recruiters in the value of getting a cross section of students
- Review and improve efforts to place students in nontraditional areas

Content

- Integrate academic and technical skills
- Show role models in the learning materials and presentations
- Incorporate employability soft skills

Facilities

- Confirm that classrooms and training facilities are accessible
- Make facilities welcoming to both genders

Retention

- Offer tutoring or study group contact information
- Explain how to access financial support for education
- Communicate counseling availability
- Plan activities to engender family support
- Encourage participation in student support groups and clubs
- Refer students to community services

Evaluation

- Disaggregate data by gender, ethnicity and special population status
- Seek balance of male and female participants
- Check if enrollment reflects the ethnic composition of your setting
- · Identify under-performing groups and plan targeted support
